enough during the warm days of our changeable winters, and thought that his bees now in that house would have to be moved in and out many times in early spring, before the weather was warm enough to let them remain out. He (the Dr.) recommended wintering on the summer stands; and it took some more honey, but we made up for it in the strength of the colonies.

**Honey-Extractors.**  
Mr. Burbank was the only member present who had one. He spoke very highly of it; nearly every one present was in favor of it, and also in favor of marketing only extracted honey—labelled with the producer's name, and the consumers will soon prefer honey to a mixture of beeswax and honey.  
There was an universal inquiry as to where bottles or glass-jars made for the purpose of putting up extracted honey could be obtained.  
(Your reporter would say to whoever has the above article for sale, that there is a Bee-Keepers' Journal published in New York, which is taken by many bee-keepers in this section—if some of them don't pay up very promptly—and would gently hint that an advertisement might pay for it.)  
On motion, the meeting adjourned, subject to the call of the president, (Dr. John Dillard, Lexington, Ky.)

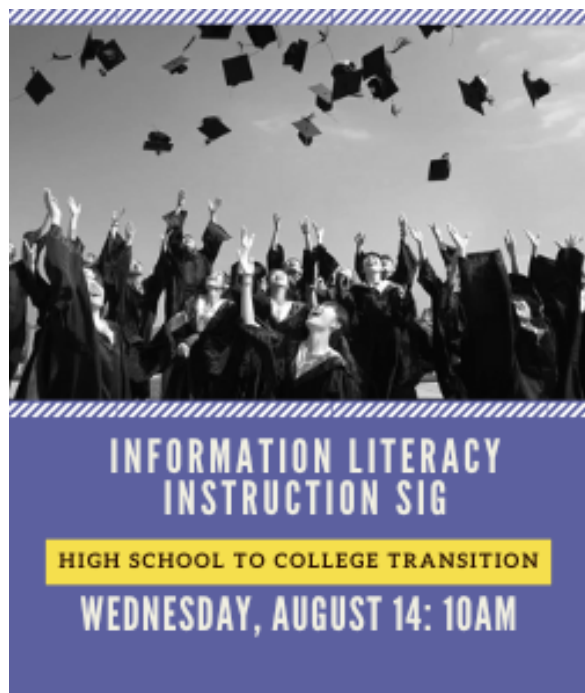
