Digital Navigators of The Hudson Valley

The application for Digital Navigators of the Hudson Valley winter 2024 session, which will run January 2024 - March 2024, is now open for individuals affiliated with libraries and organizations in the Hudson Valley.

The program is open to anyone who works at a library or a community-based organization that would like to offer Digital Navigator services to their patrons. Applications are open to individuals who work at libraries and nonprofit organizations in the following counties: Columbia, Greene, Dutchess, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Sullivan, Ulster, and Westchester. This cohort is open to both individuals who have previously trained as a Digital Navigator and those who are new to the program.

Digital Navigators are trusted guides who assist community members in accessing and using technology. The formal program will provide you with resources to provide client service in assistance with affordable internet access, device acquisition, technical skills, and application support.

Visit the [Digital Navigators of the Hudson Valley website](#) to view the requirements for the program. Navigators who meet the requirements by March 31, 2024 will receive a \$500 investment incentive that is payable to their organization.

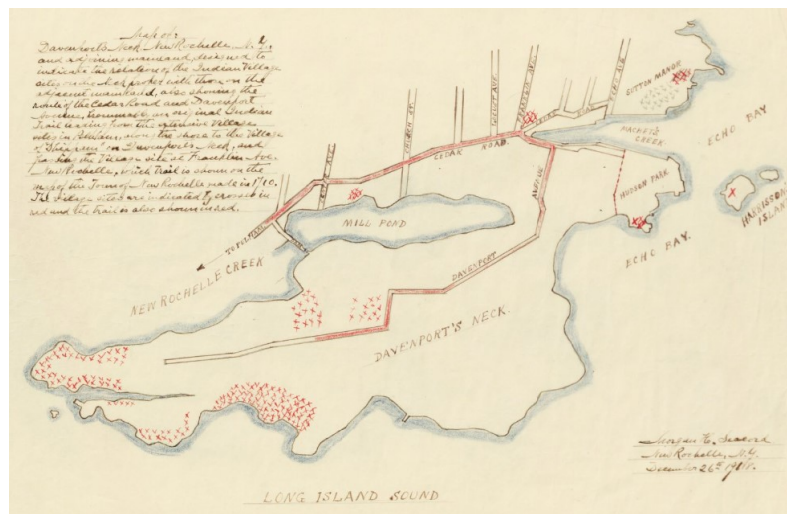

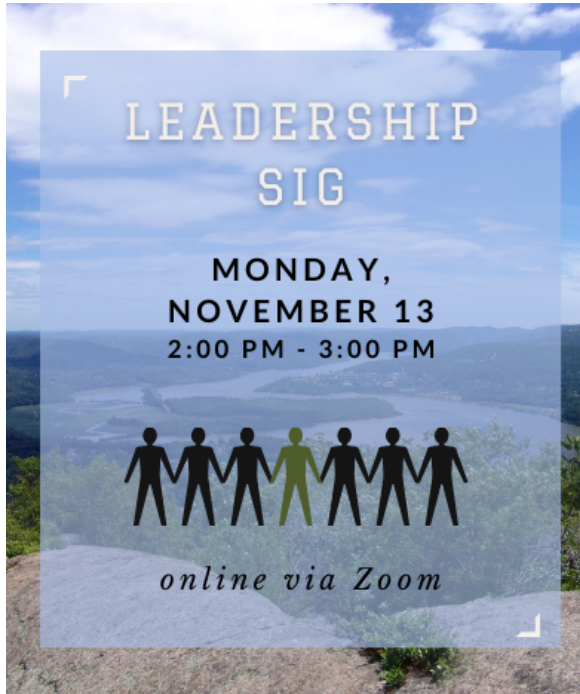
